# **TAUWHARENIKAU TRAIL—UNDERHILL ROAD**



The final piece of the puzzle is now in place with the commissioning of the new trail extension which runs from the southern trail gate to the seal on Underhill Road, Featherston. The southern portion of Underhill Road can be busy at times with trucks coming and going from a nearby quarry but now cycling from Featherston to the Tauwharenikau Rail Trail Bridge is now so much safer. The Greytown Trails Trust (GTT) in partnership with

the South Wairarapa District Council (SWDC) and local contractor Pope and Gray established the 2.2 km trail running adjacent to the gravel section on the upwind section of Underhill Rd South. The construction team from Pope and Gray led by John Gray and funded by the SWDC was constructed in May this

year and commissioned for use. The trail crosses Underhill Rd in a couple of places so it is necessary to exercise caution when swapping from one side to the other. GTT will continue to maintain and manage the trail inside the gates and in proximity to the bridge. The establishment of this side track now completes the bridge link project. It is a magnificent achievement after 10 years of planning and significant hours invested by the trustees. Our vision to provide a link between Greytown and Featherston via a cycling trail across the Tauwharenikau has now come
